Prayer for Belief. Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through You I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. Thank You for paying my debt on the cross and offering me complete forgiveness. Knowing that You have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive You as my Savior and Lord.

How do I take the Lord's Supper?

To receive the Lord's Supper, follow the ushers' direction to come by row to one of the stations at the front or back of the auditorium. Please raise your seat as you stand up to allow others to pass by.

Take a piece of unleavened bread and dip it into the cup. You may then eat the bread or wait until you return to your seat.
